With support from the Sloan Foundation, the Mozilla Science Lab has helped it to grow such that, in the past year, we've reached more than 4,000 researchers and librarians worldwide and trained over 195 instructors (from the sciences and library sciences) who carry the torch and run Software Carpentry workshops on their own.
